### 1. Fables and Folk Tales Topic A Bottle of Dew

- Daily-life example: If a friend asks you to finish a huge project in one evening, it is better to explain the time needed and plan properly instead of saying “yes” and failing later.

**Q1. How did the fox trick the raven? Explain the steps.**
